HEALTH AND SAFETY

ANIMALS

Dangerous animals can be found throughout the Kimberley. If seen, do not intimidate. Withdraw and alert others in the area.

SLIPS AND FALLS

Home Valley Station has inherent dangers. Challenging walks require care negotiating large rocks, creek beds, water and sandy sections. By wearing suitable footwear, obeying your guide and signs and employing common sense, you will minimise the chance of injury.

HEAT ILLNESS

Drink water, wear a hat and rest in shade to minimise heat problems.

TAKE WITH YOU

- **Sturdy and enclosed footwear (thongs are not suitable)**
- **Camera, Fishing Gear, Binoculars**
- **Swimming attire, towel, sunscreen**
- **Water, Snacks**
- **Wide brim hat**
- **A small backpack to carry any loose items**

THE FOLLOWING TOURS & ACTIVITIES ARE FREE!

BINDOOLA FALLS & BILLABONG TRAIL: Turn right on the Gibb River Road from the Homestead and travel 15.5kms. Look for a parking sign followed by a parking area on the right hand side of the road. From the parking area follow the Markers to the Billabong.

NYARLI LAGOON: Approx 12kms from the Homestead heading west. On the right hand side of the road – in about 200m. Ideal for bird watching.

HOME VALLEY LOOKOUT: Approx 4kms from Home Valley Station heading west. Look for parking area on left hand side of road.

BINDOOLA GORGE TRAIL: Departing the Homestead by foot, walk past Grass Castle 8 and you will see a sign for Bindoola Creek. Follow the graded track until you see a sign on a tree with a yellow arrow for Bindoola Creek Trail. Follow the markings along the trail.

CLONTARF TRACK: This 4WD track starts at the end of our driveway - engage 4WD and follow the track which provides guests with a scenic drive.

SALMOND RIVER FISHING HOLE "SCOTTY'S": Travelling east for approx 9kms from the Homestead toward the Pentecost Crossing, turn right through the gate and follow the track—see map.
