

# More details of filming

Last week The Kimberley Echo published a picture of some of the 'eliminated' beauties from a television reality show being filmed on Home Valley Station.

This week, station publicist Nicolle Fenech has supplied more details of the production.

Home Valley Station will be showcased across Europe to a viewing audience of millions when the Dutch series of Outback Jack hits the air on October 7.

The series features 11 beauties from Holland and Belgium flown into the outback to compete for the affections of

'Jack', 28-year-old merchant navy navigator Luke Brooks from Tasmania.

The series also features significant cameos from Home Valley Station staff and indigenous trainees who assisted the Kanakna production crew in scouting locations, managing local wildlife appearances and setting up countless sets.

Belgium soap star beauty Lien Van De Kelder and popular Holland television personality Art Rooijackers front the series as hosts.

The production has been a logistical challenge for both the production crew

and the Home Valley Station staff.

Together they have successfully moved 60 cast and crew, and tonnes of equipment across the station from location to location.

Richard 'Diesel' Evans, representing the Balangarra people, plays a significant role in the series as the indigenous face of Australia.
