### HEALTH AND SAFETY

#### ANIMALS

Dangerous animals can be found throughout the Kimberley. If seen, do not intimidate. Withdraw and alert others in the area.

#### SLIPS AND FALLS

Sections along the area are rocky and challenging. Take care negotiating large rocks, creek beds, water and sandy sections. By wearing suitable footwear, obeying your guide and signs and employing common sense, you will minimise the chance of injury.

#### HEAT ILLNESS

Drink water, wear a hat and rest in shade to minimise heat problems.

### TRAIL FACT SHEET - SELF GUIDED- 2 HOURS

Travelling approximately 5mins or 4kms from the Homestead, the Home Valley Lookout is open to the public and is gazetted on most traveller's maps. Easily found, just off the Gibb River Road heading west from our driveway (turn right) and not far past the jump-up. Look for the parking area on the left hand side off the road.

Mobile phone coverage. Those guests who wish to stay in touch when on holidays travelling with their Telstra Next G mobile phones and Next G internet access may be able to get service from this lookout.

Don't litter. Please take all your rubbish with you. This includes cigarette butts, fruit peel and toilet paper. It is against the law to disturb or destroy the local flora and fauna. Never touch or tamper with Rock Art and/or Artifacts.

#### TRAIL SIGNAGE & MARKERS

The suggested route is marked to guide you safely to the attractions and back. Please follow the markers and keep to the route at all times. Moving off the route will damage this sensitive environment.



#### USEFUL INFORMATION

This scenic location was made famous by Baz Luhrmann, when in 2003 on a reconnaissance mission to find the location of his epic movie — *Australia* stood at this same lookout and surveyed the majesty of the valley across the Pentecost River to the Cockburn Range and knew he must make his movie in the East Kimberley. Later in 2006, amongst other locations, this spot at Home Valley became the starting point for the car and truck scene whereby Nicole Kidman's character Lady Sarah Ashley is seen huffing and puffing on her way to Faraway Downs.
